


The




Sophomores



The 1989 Varsity Wildcats defended their District championship title remaining undefeated in District play for their second straight season. The Mighty Wildcats also retained their Bi-District crown again in 1989, making this season an exciting one for the fans.

The Wildcats began the season with a great win, defeating the Mission Eagles, a tough 5-A team, by the score of 28-24. In the next game, the Cats played the Medina Valley Panthers. The Wildcats played tough defense, but never clicked on offense, battling to a 0-0 tie. The Cats then went into a short slump, losing their next two games to Uvalde and West Campus. The Cats then went on to play Laredo Cigarroa. The Cats displayed an explosive offense and won the game 34-6.

The following week the Cats began District play, defeating the Pearsall Mavericks 21-0. The Cats continued their winning streak, remaining victorious for the next four district games, earning the 1989 District 29 3-A title. The Cats then successfully defended their Bi-District title by defeating the Taft Greyhounds. The following week the Cats fell short, losing to the Bishop Badgers, for the Area Championship.

Throughout the year the Cats played with desire and with intensity. Leading the offense with outstanding performances were Seniors Patrick Byrd, George Brady, Joe Almendarez, Frank Cortez, John Patterson and Junior Abel Almendarez. The Cats were a well balanced offense as Seniors Jesse Beltran and J. J. Olivarez did a fine job opening holes for the backs. The hard hitting defense was led by Seniors Eddie Gonzalez, Warren Lowery, Jesse Beltran, Ken Plocek, and Junior Joseph Moreno. Congratulations to the Wildcats for another great season.


