The Varsity Wildcats finished this year 4-6 with a fourth place finish in district. It was the start of a new district with Lytle and Somerset leaving and Jourdanton and Poteet entering. The winds of change didn't stop with just district competition, this was also Coach Don Tate's last year and the last year Thomas Taylor would be showing his support on the sidelines. It was sad in the end and I am sure the Wildcats and every Wildcat fan wanted to send Coach Tate and Mr. Taylor away with a win.

Wildcat statistical leader's were as follows: Jonas Trevino tore up the field 1039 yards rushing, Lee Hernandez aired out 570 yards passing, Alfredo Martinez beat the defense 364 yards receiving, Paul Gorricks averaged 37.3 yards per punt, Jonas Trevino lit up the score board with a total of 48 points, Ricardo Rubalcava sprinted past the kicker for 396 return yards, Matt Lackey dominated the line with a 62.1% blocking average, Ricardo Rubalcava soared over receivers with 3 interceptions, Paul Gorricks had 5 passer pressures, Nick Castano dominated the pass rush with 6 sacks, Chema Rodriguez was the king of the turnover with three fumble recoveries and 83 tackles, and from the middle linebacker spot, Abraham Diaz shut people down with 112 tackles on the season. 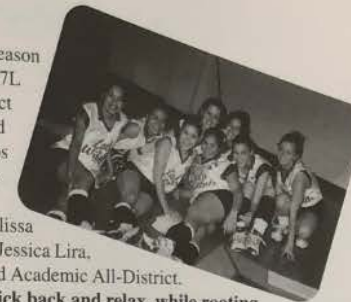

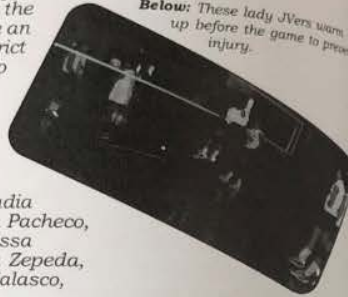

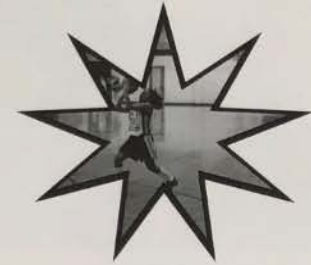

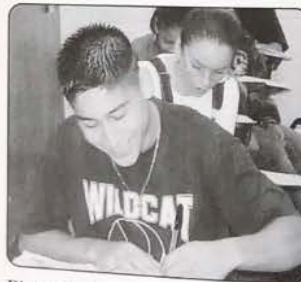

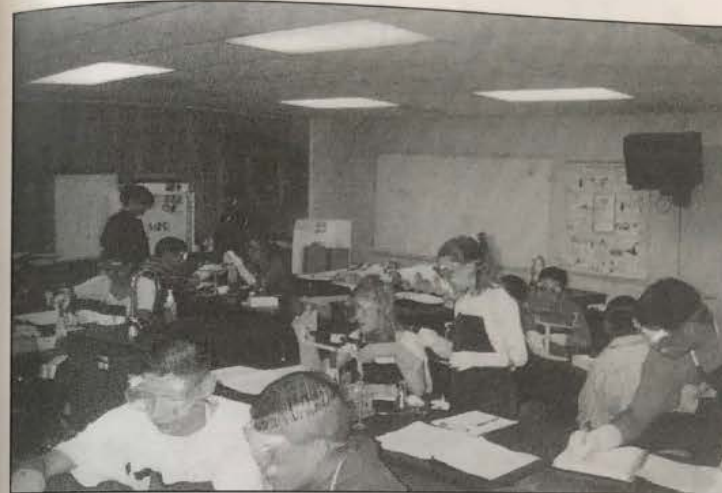

TAAS participants studied hard this year and the reward certainly paid off. Carrizo Springs High School is now a Texas Academically Recognized school.

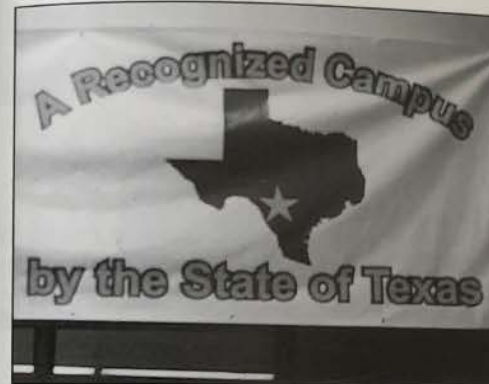
In the reading section of the TAAS, a total of 84% passed. In the math section, a whopping 89% passed, and in the writing section, 89% of the students passed.

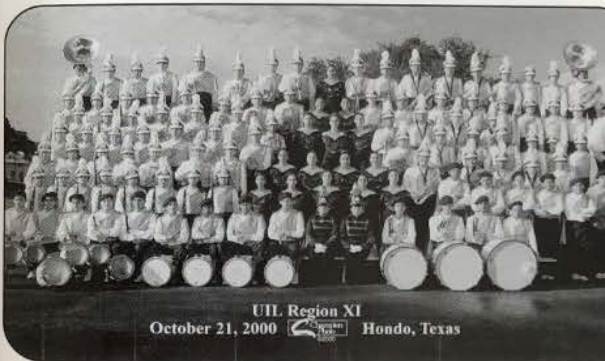

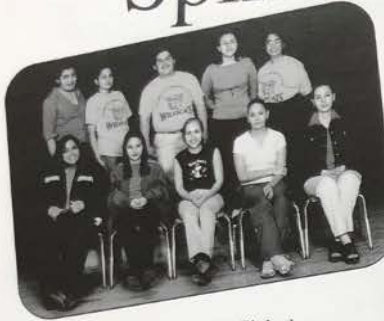

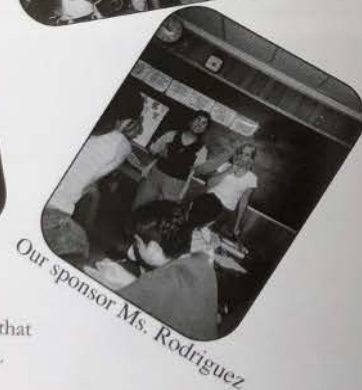

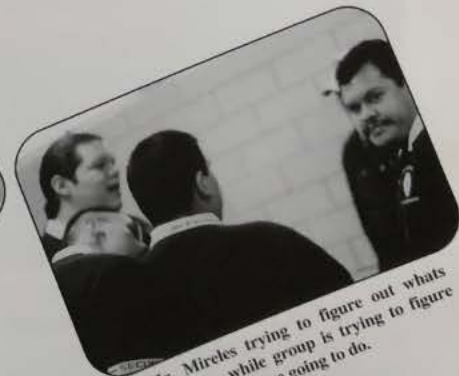
The Wildcat Law Enforcement team changed over the period of time from when they all came together to when they finally split apart. Yet throughout the year, they stayed the same.

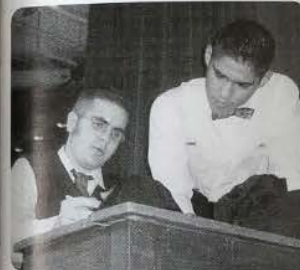

Playstation 2 and the latest Nintendo made the virtual world more entertaining.



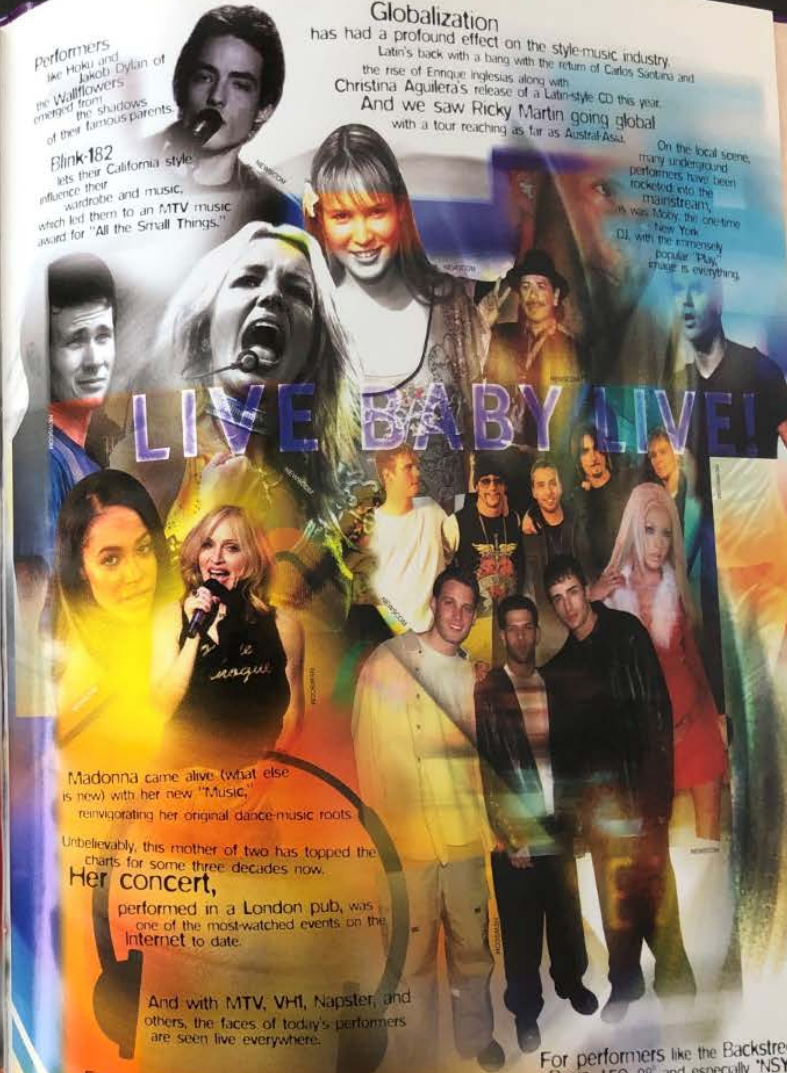
Performers like Hoku and Jakob Dylan of the Wallflowers emerged from the shadows of their famous parents.
