




The year opened with the Lady Wildcat volleyball team making history in winning the first bidistrict volleyball championship for Carrizo High. Perhaps the hilight of the season was a thrilling home victory over the previously unbeaten Hondo Owls. It was a volleyball season to remember.

Although the football Cats struggled through district play, this team was determined to earn a playoff spot and they did just that. The Wildcats' bi-district home game against Bandera brought them another championship.

As spring rolled around, Wildcat athletes continued their winning ways. Junior golfer Jennifer Sheridan captured her second district championship and advanced to regionals for the third year in a row. The boys golf team of M. Blake, C. Johnson, C. Walker, O. Valdez and A. Bhakta were district runners-up and advanced to regionals as well.

The Lady Wildcat softball team was back in the playoffs as the district runners-up. Once again, both boys and girls track teams sent several members to the regional meet in Kingsville. Sam Johnson defended his state title in the discus by capturing gold for the second year in a row.

Many Wildcat student athletes represented Carrizo High with great honor as they were selected to 28 AAA all district teams in their respective sports. Two of these athletes, seniors Sam Johnson and Giovanni Gonzalez received higher honors being named to the Class 3A All State Football team.

The night of November 6, 1998, was a night that students, players, and Wildcat fans were anxiously anticipating.



1998 Homecoming court.












