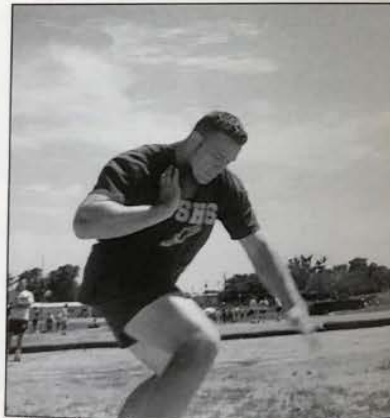

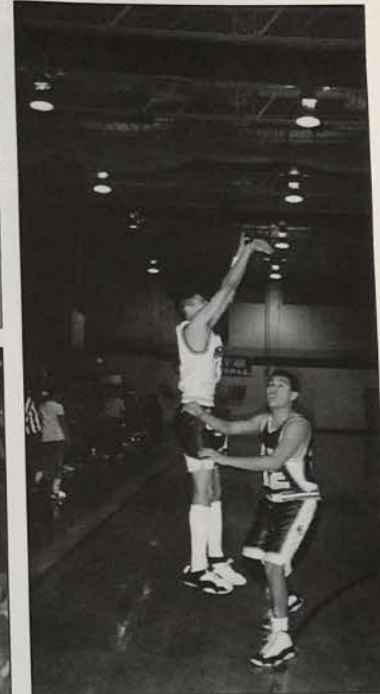

Homecoming 1998 was kicked off with the traditional bonfire, and community pep rally. Players and fans were fired up with enthusiasm for the game.

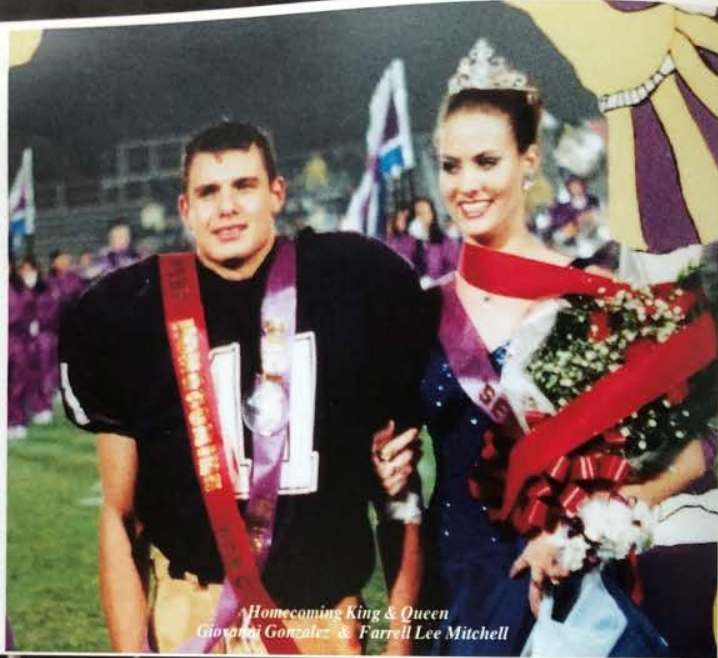
The night of November 6, 1998, was a night that students, players, and Wildcat fans were anxiously anticipating.

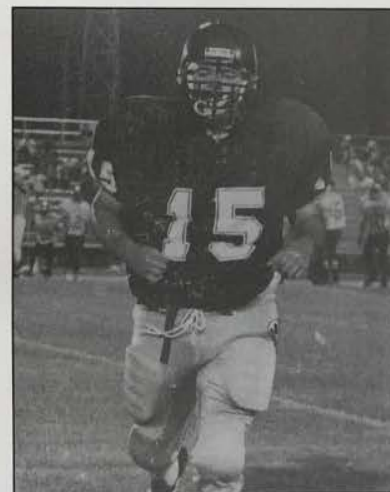

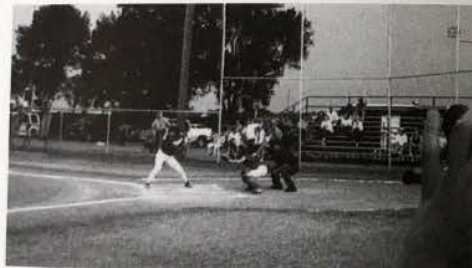

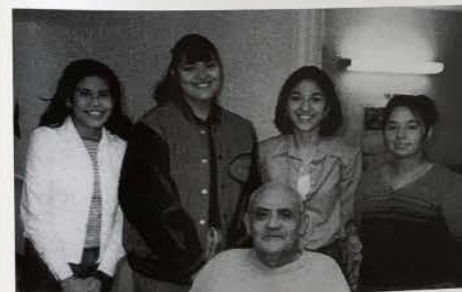

The Tutors worked with the students three days a week for an hour. In practicing and reviewing the material on the test, the Tutors also stressed some extra test-taking skills. The T.A.A.S. Tutors have passed the T.A.A.S. Test with at least an average score or above. Their math teachers recommend them as well.

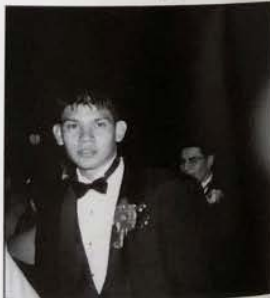

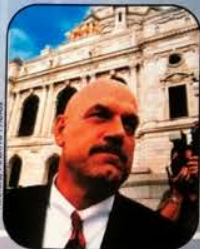

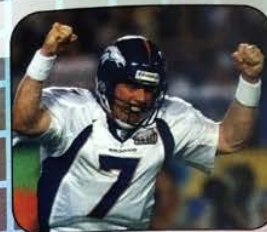
