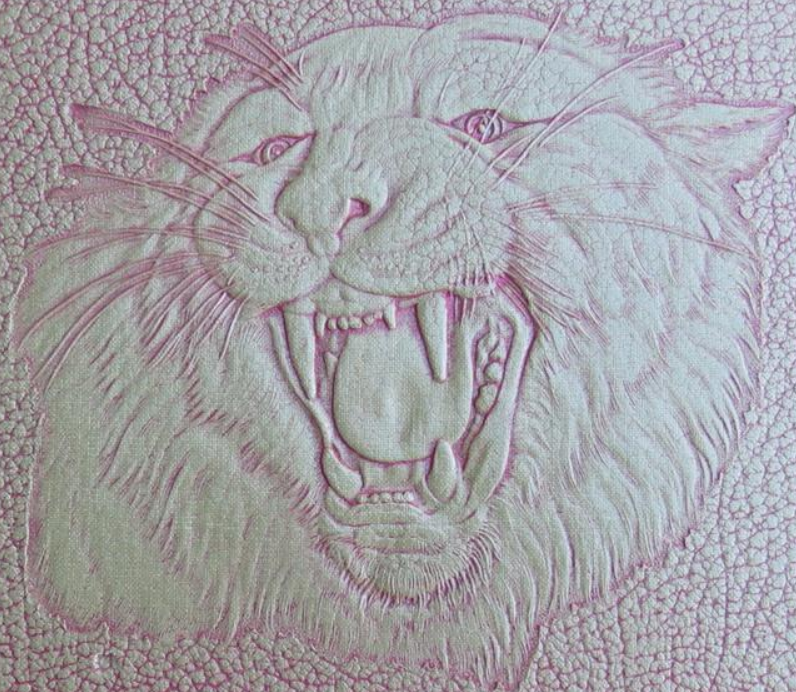

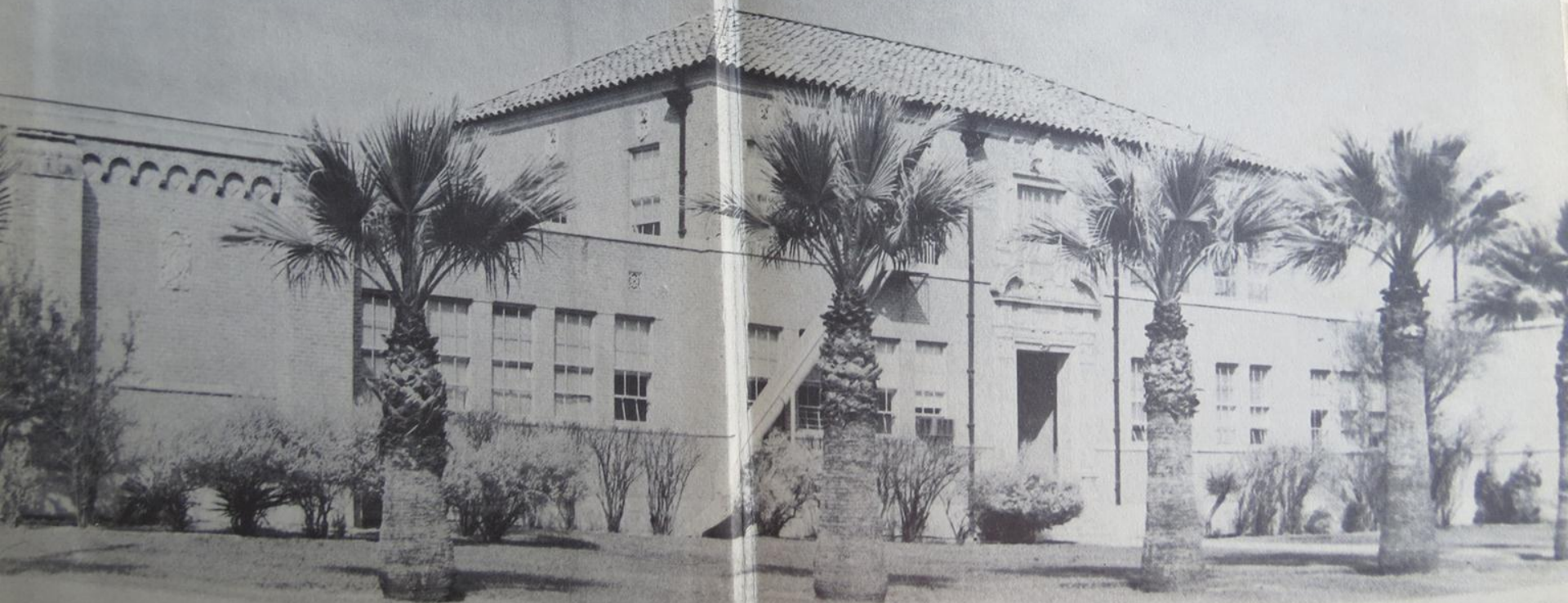

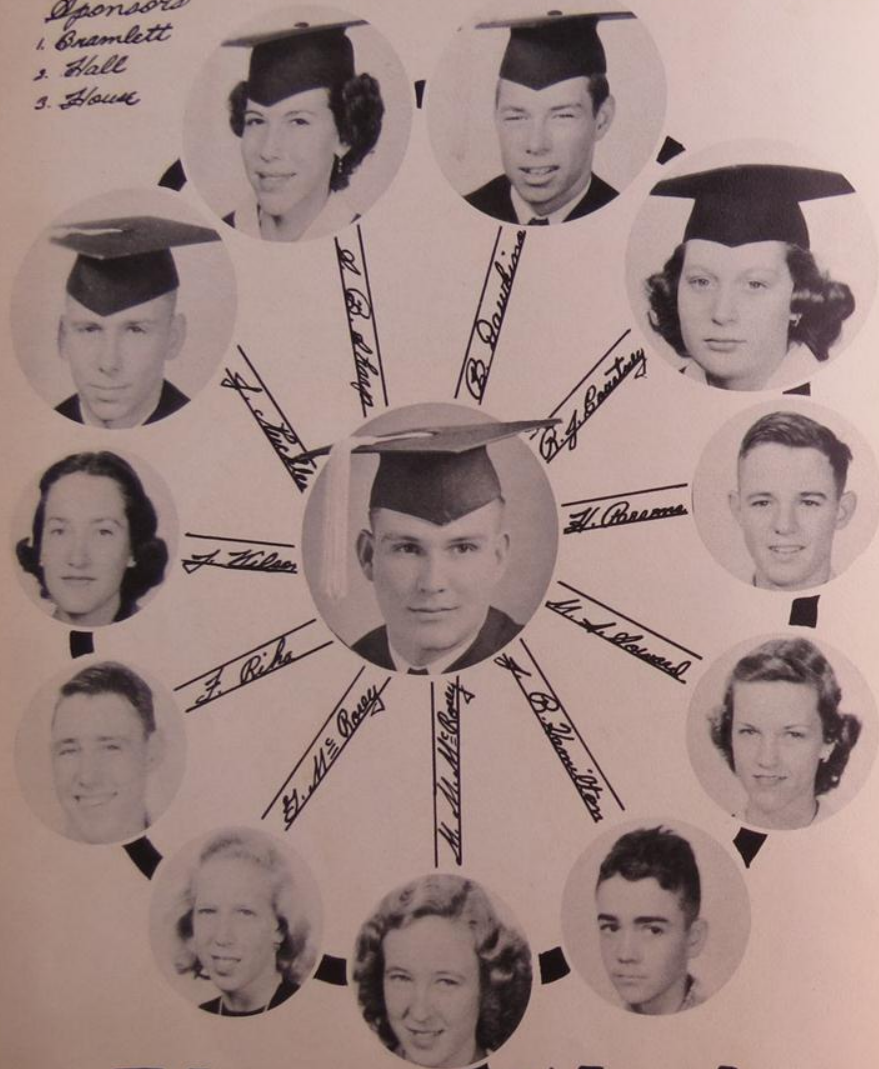
To mention all the good deeds they have bestowed upon our school would more than fill these pages. Therefore, we print only the major improvements in which Mr. Gustine led the way.

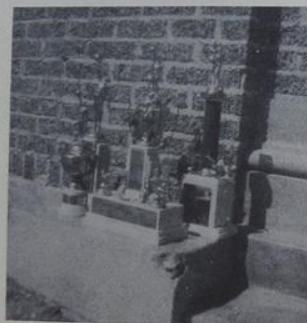
