




Since Mr. Gustine came to Carrizo in 1947 our educational program as well as our school spirit has traveled to new peaks. To him and the fine trustees behind him go the credit of the new buildings sprinkled across our campus that make school life more enjoyable and agreeable. His only goal has been to see our standards and character improved.

To mention all the good deeds they have bestowed upon our school would more than fill these pages. Therefore, we print only the major improvements in which Mr. Gustine led the way.

A new vocational agricultural building, the best in the area; elementary building with 18 class rooms, health room, offices, auditorium, etc.; an enlarged cafeteria; a band building; extension of the grand stand by 1800 seats; additional 386 square miles to the district's responsibility; modernization of existing buildings; addition of a special education department; institution of a Texas State Teacher's Association in the county; and a faculty increase from 41 to 50 teachers.

The final party of the year in honor of the Seniors of 1952, was given at the American Legion Hut, following the graduation exercises Thursday night.


