



Today we look back on a year during which all of us, students and faculty alike, worked to bring about progress on the part of our school, for it is only by constructive growth that we can justify our existence.


We have had a visiting committee of school people pass judgment on us, have been commended by them in certain respects, and have received their suggestions for certain improvements.


