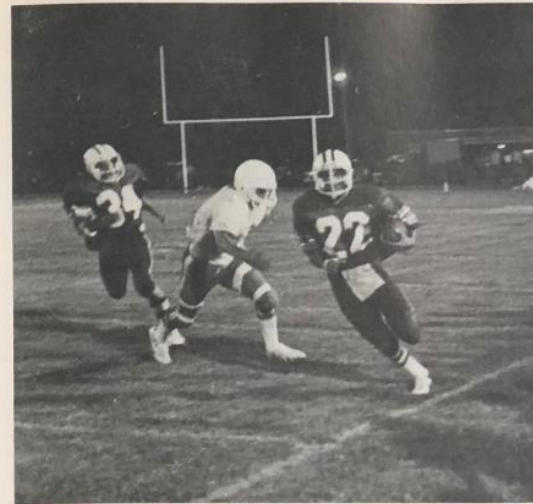
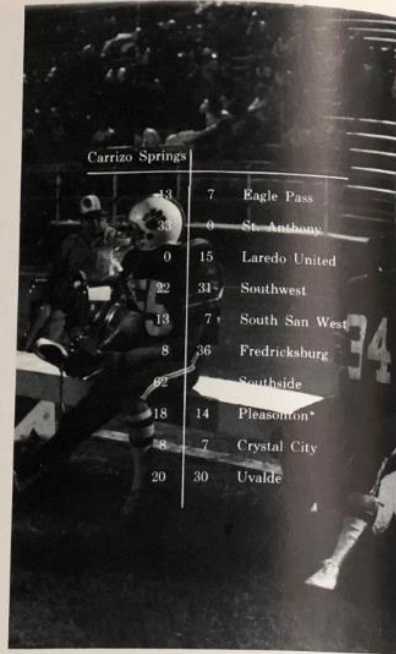
Wildcats of 1982

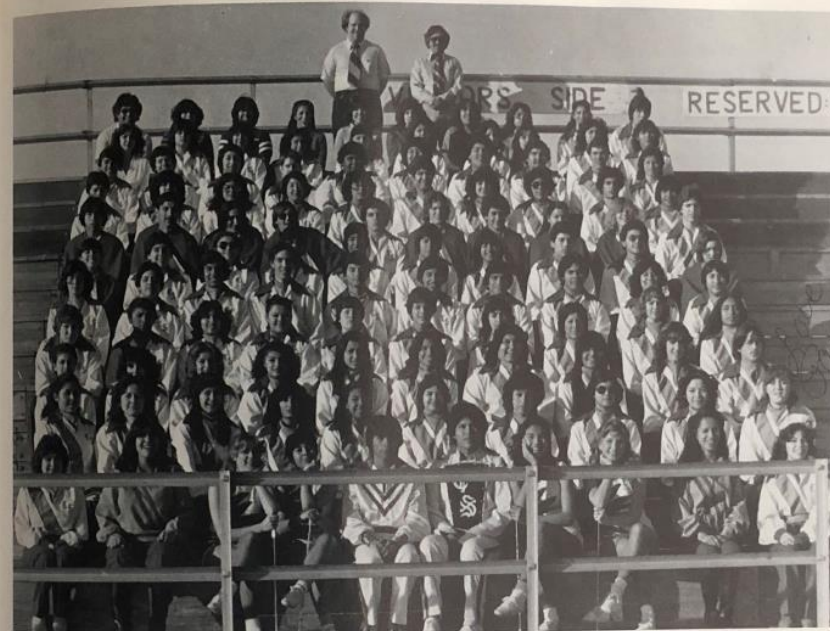
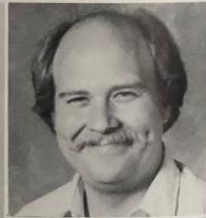


Band Exhibits Fine Talent

Student Council Responsibilities Carried Out

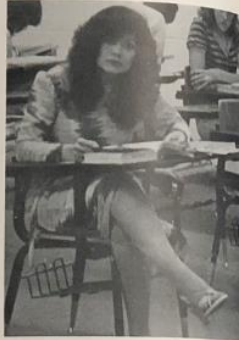

This society will undoubtedly look back at a very productive year.

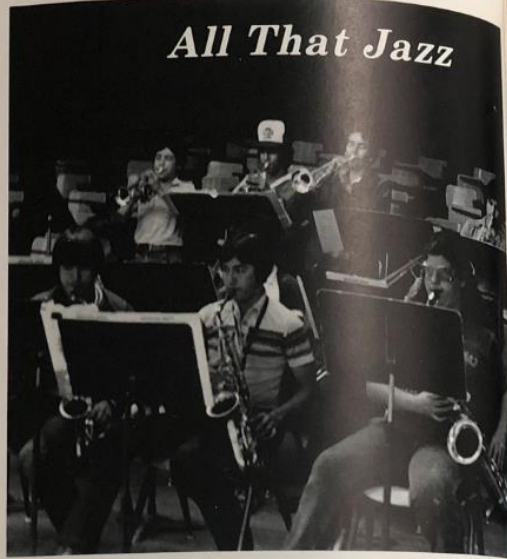

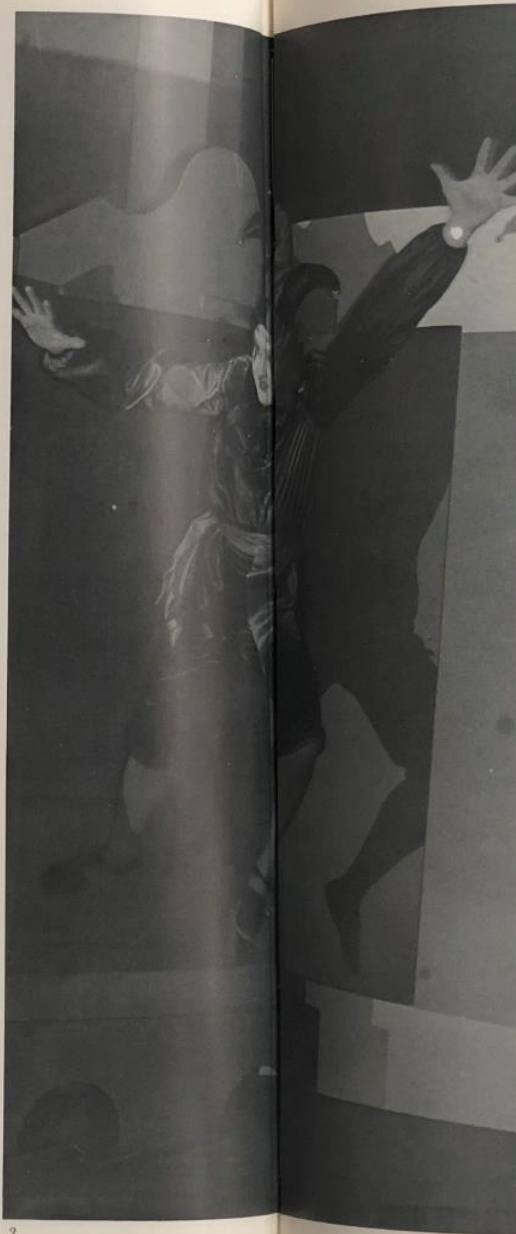

The golf team this year had its fortunes and misfortunes just like any sport. "Teeing off" to several tournaments around the area, the team managed to win several trophies. Among their winnings

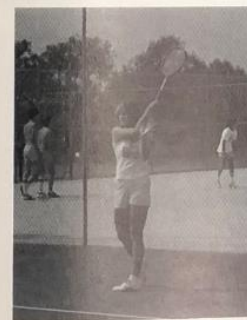
