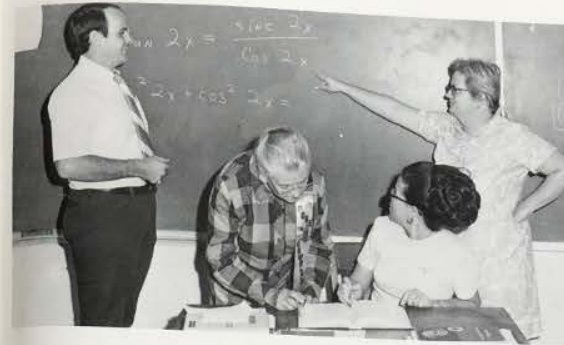


Social Studies

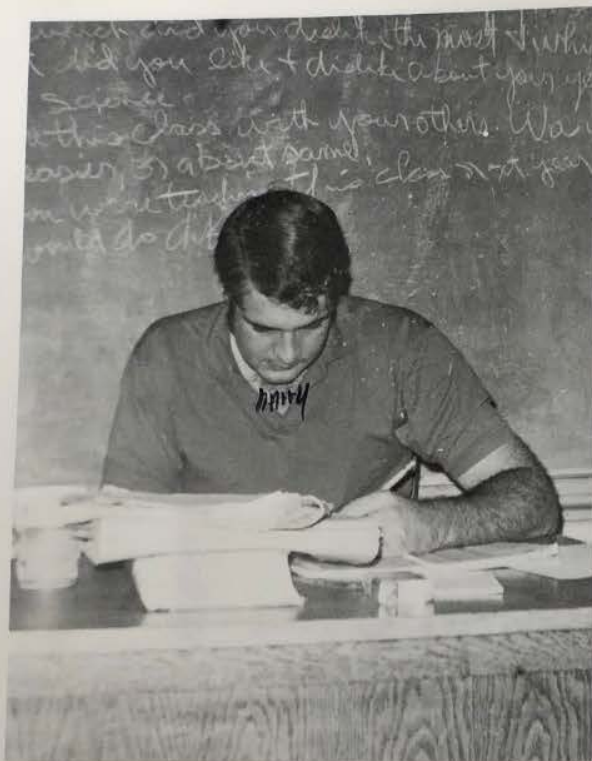
Music

Cats Have 5-5 Football Season

The Carrizo Springs Wildcats started rebuilding toward another district championship during the 1971 Football season. Inexperience and the loss of 17 seniors hurt the Wildcats this year, but a potent junior varsity should prove superior in the years to come. The Cats ended the season with a 5-5 record.

The opening game of the year was against the Crystal City Javelines. Touchdowns by Juan Perez and Elifonso Esquivel lead the Wildcats to a 20-6 victory. The following week the

Cats lost to Del Rio, 31-0.

The Wildcats gained their third victory of the season against the Pearsall Mavericks. Juan Perez, Alonzo Munoz, and Nick Castellanos each tallied to lead the Cats to an 18-13 win.

Carrizo dropped their next three games to Southwest, Medina Valley,

and Hondo. The losses took the Wildcats out of contention for their second straight district championship.

On October 29, the Cats played their eighth game of the season against Poteet. Nick Castellanos led the Wildcat attack as he passed for two touchdowns and ran for another. The Cats lost their next game to Devine.

The Wildcats ended the 1971 season with a 7-0 victory over Cotulla. Juan Perez scored the game's only touchdown, as he rushed for 173 yards. Tommy Lopez added 17 yards,

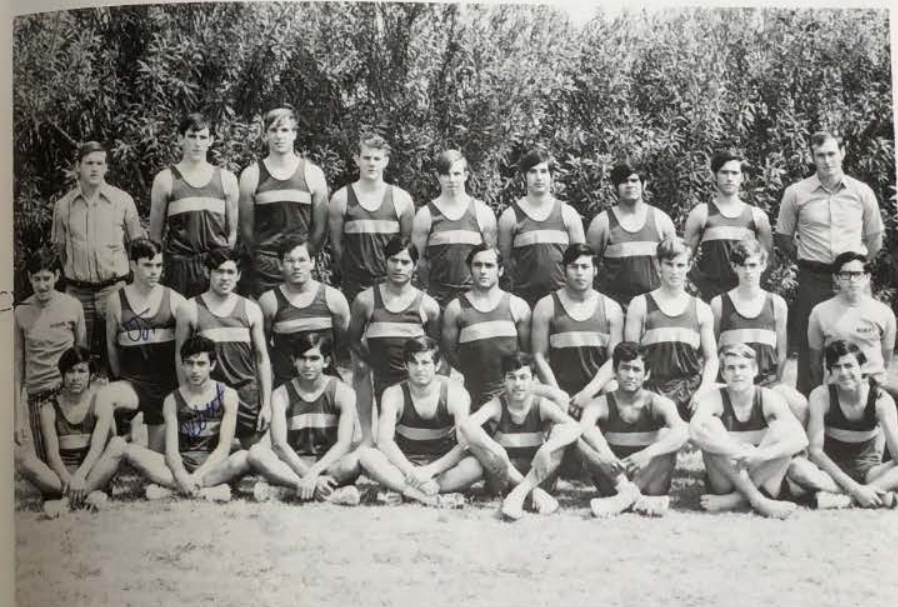

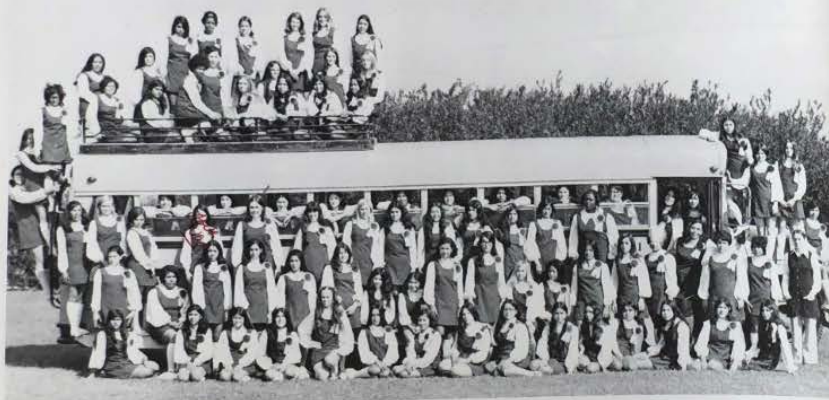
