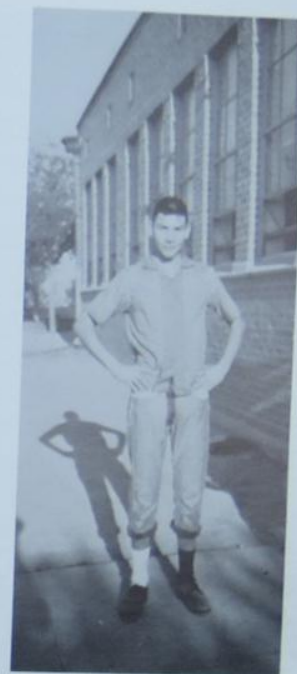

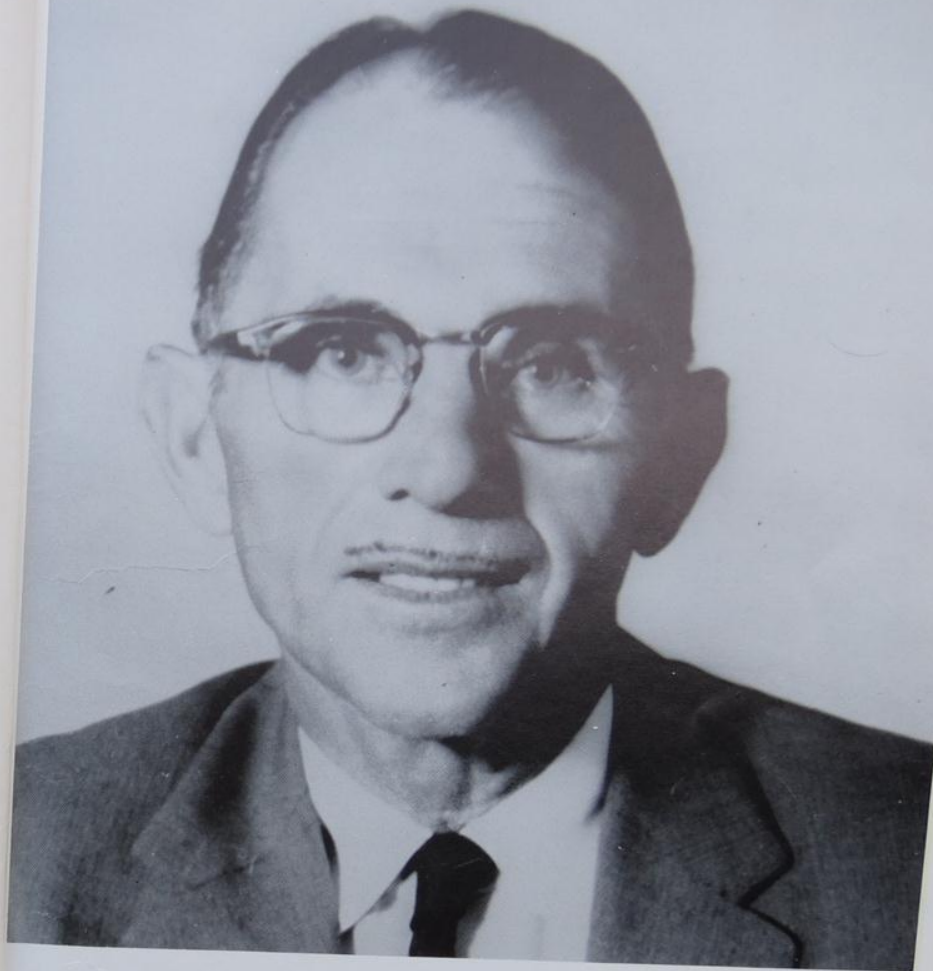
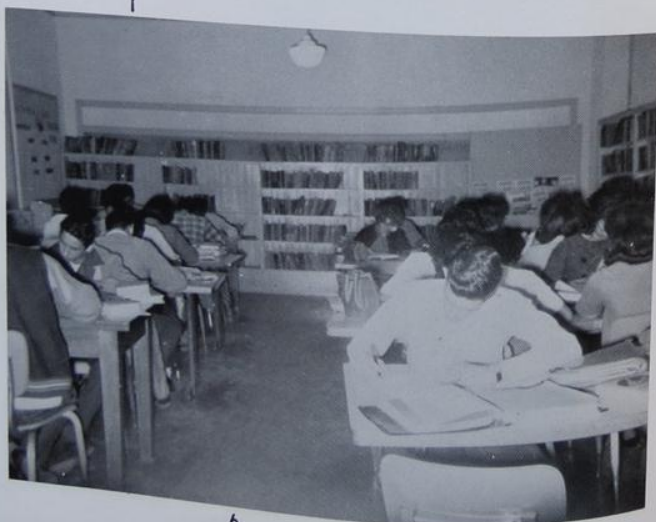


and a New Sense of Values

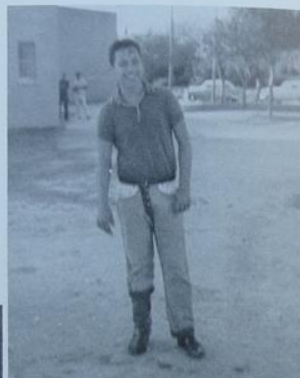
They also learn to be good followers. Proper parliamentary procedure is stressed; each club is faculty sponsored.
