



#### TEACHER'S SHOWCASE






The 1992-93 Freshman class was an unusually large one. Most came to high school not knowing what to expect, but were glad when upperclassmen didn't get to initiate them.


They didn't play as good as they could in the Bi-District game against a good Sinton team, and their season ended.
