



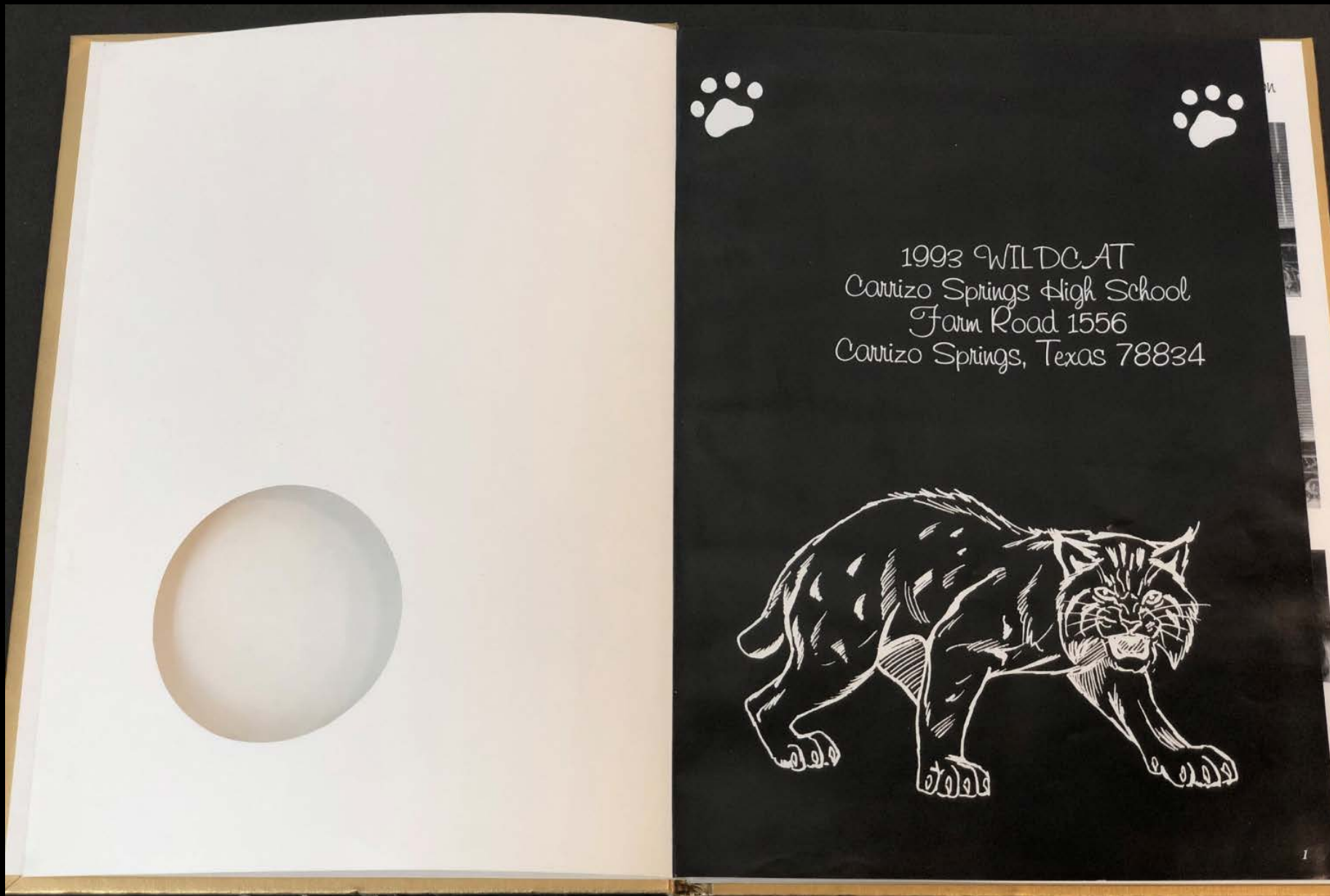

TEACHER'S SHOWCASE

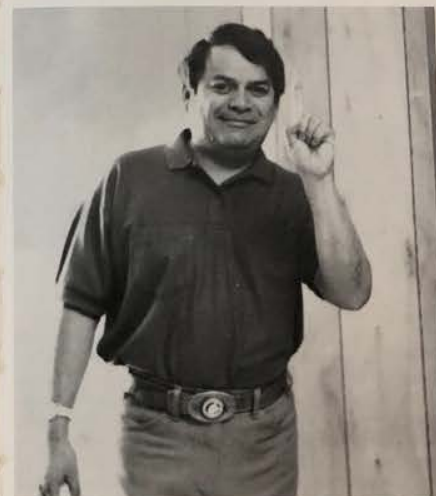
RENE HERNANDEZ

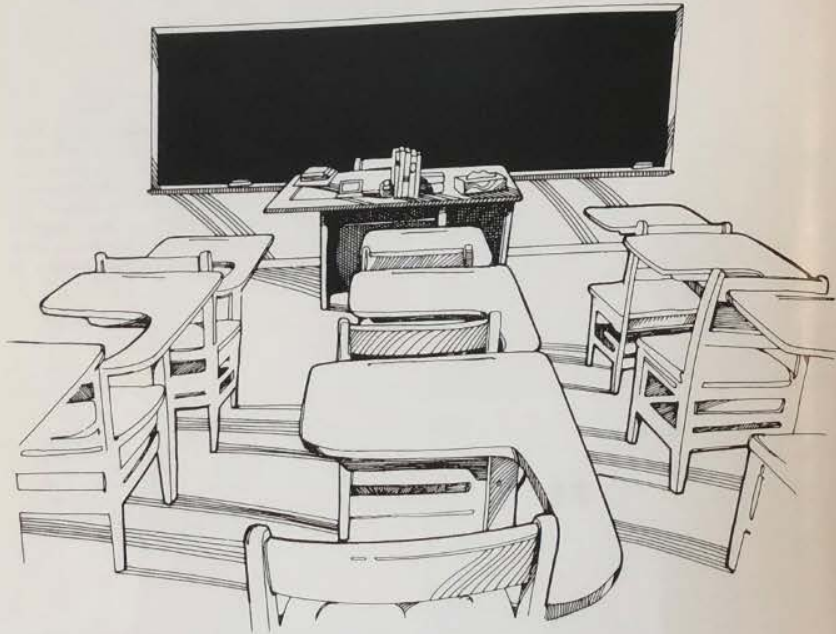

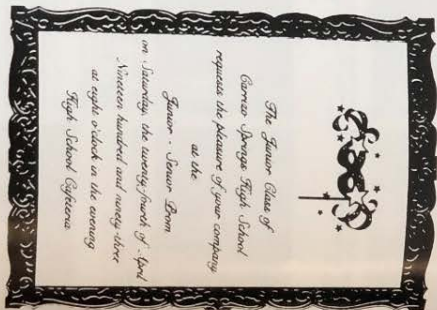
Junior go to new heights for prom decorations.

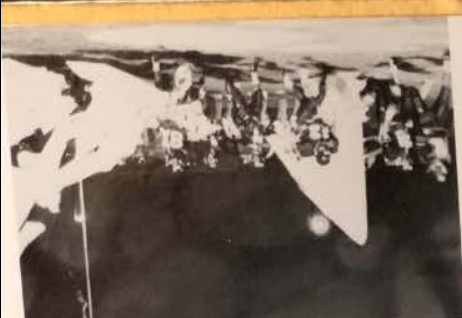
