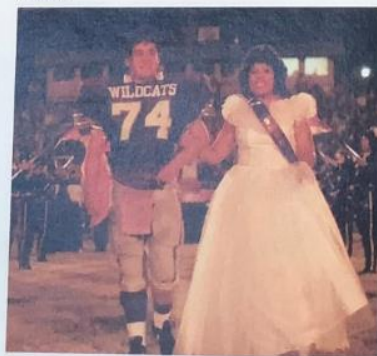
Homecoming Queen — Yvonne Castaneda — escorted by Omar Ybarra

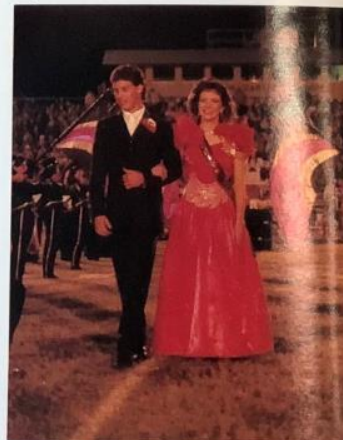

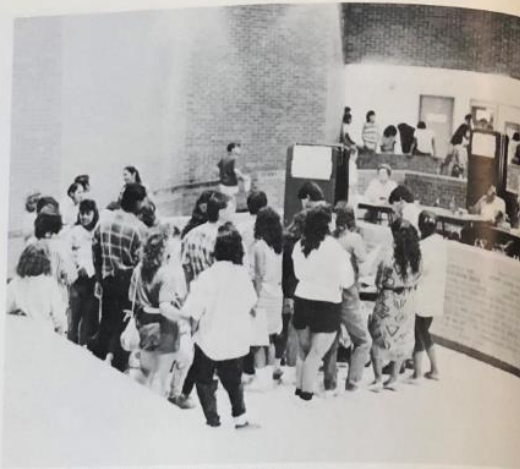

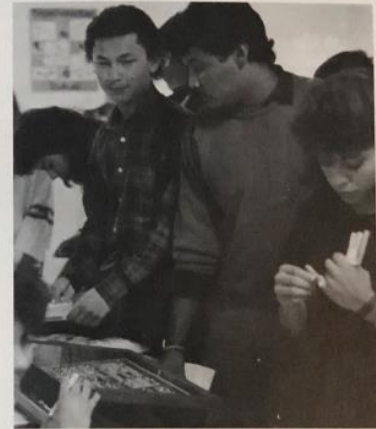

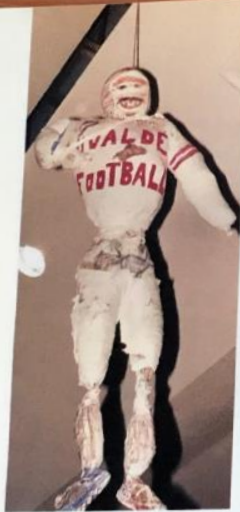

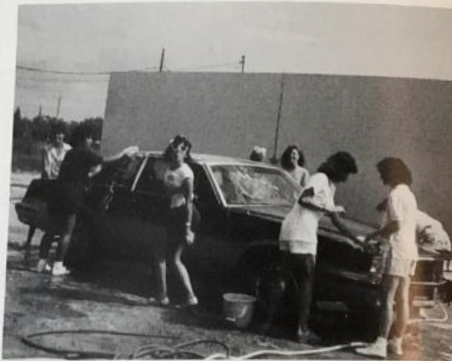

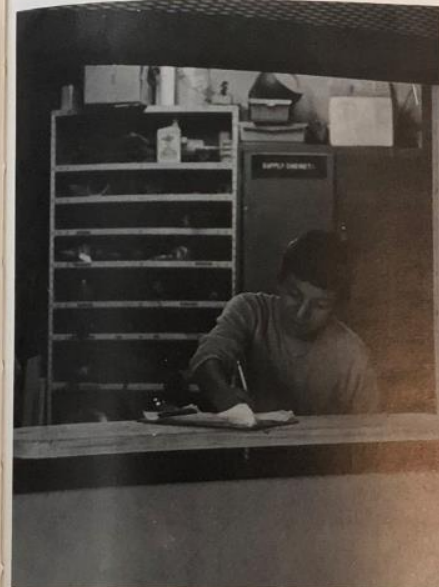

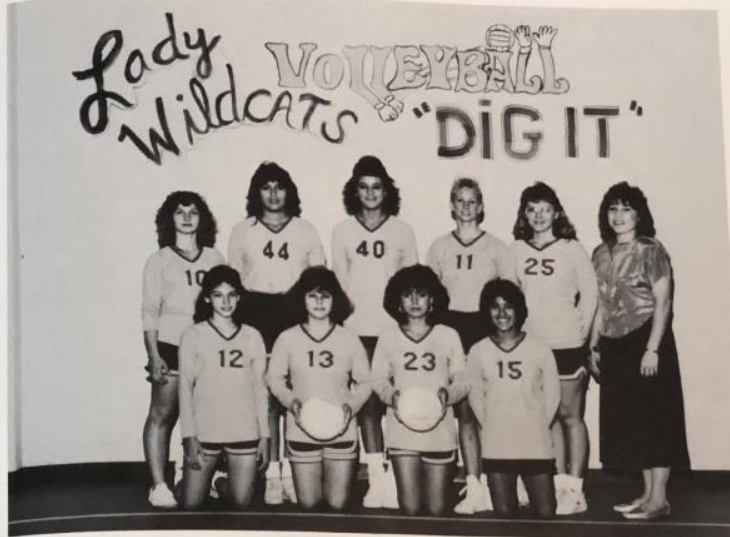

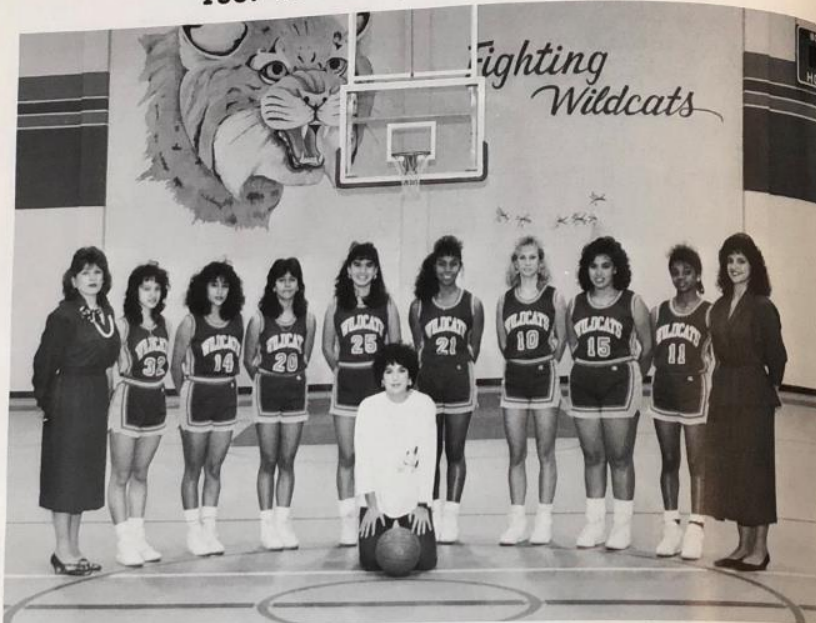

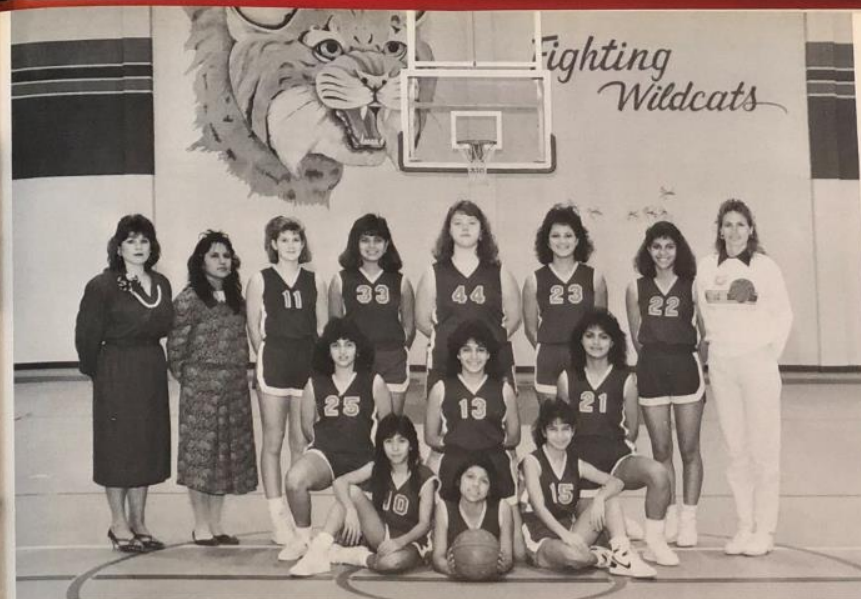
