## CSHS PROUD TO BE DRUG FREE

Many things were done this year to help promote a drug free environment this year. Activities included establishing an anti-drug group, being the home of the first anti-drug concert, and designating CSHS a Drug Free/Gun Free school zone.

RAD, Resist Alcohol & Drugs, was introduced this year. Members included students from all grade levels. The sponsor for RAD was Mr. Estrada. Officers were Estella Diaz-President, Domitago Lumbreras-Vice President, Ornita Ortiz-Secretary, and Sharon Lozano. Treasurer.

RAD sponsored activities such as the Positive Attitude Contest with the prize of a trip to Fiesta Texas for forty people, trutoducing the I Care Hotline, and sponsoring the Patsy Tortes concert.

The Nutional Youth I Care Hotline is a 24 hour phone service made available to CSHS students. Everyone was encounted to call by Ken Harris, a representative from the hotline. Mr. Harris explained that use of the hotline was not directed especially to students with drug problems but to any student with any problem. The service would last will May of 1993.

Paisy Torres and The Full Force Band gave a concert in the gym to promote several drug awareness messages. High school students were dismissed during the last five minutes of third period to attend. After lunch, students from Central and Middle Elementary attended the concert. At the end of the second concert, Mrs. Torres was presented a RAD t-shirt from several members.

Caritio Springs High School was officially designated as a Drug Free/Gun Free school zone by Ed Hodges, a representative from State Senator Phil Grumm and Ron Ederer, the LLS. Attorney General. Both men attended a ceremony along with student council members, all class officers, and all Rad members in the band hall. A brief welcome was given by Mr. Saldana, then, Mr. Costilla introduced the guests. Oralia Ortiz gave a speech on why it was important to lead drug-free life. Mr. Ederer informed students on statistics of drug relations among teens. Mr. Hodges explained the consequences of what would happen if someone were to violate rules in our new school zone.




