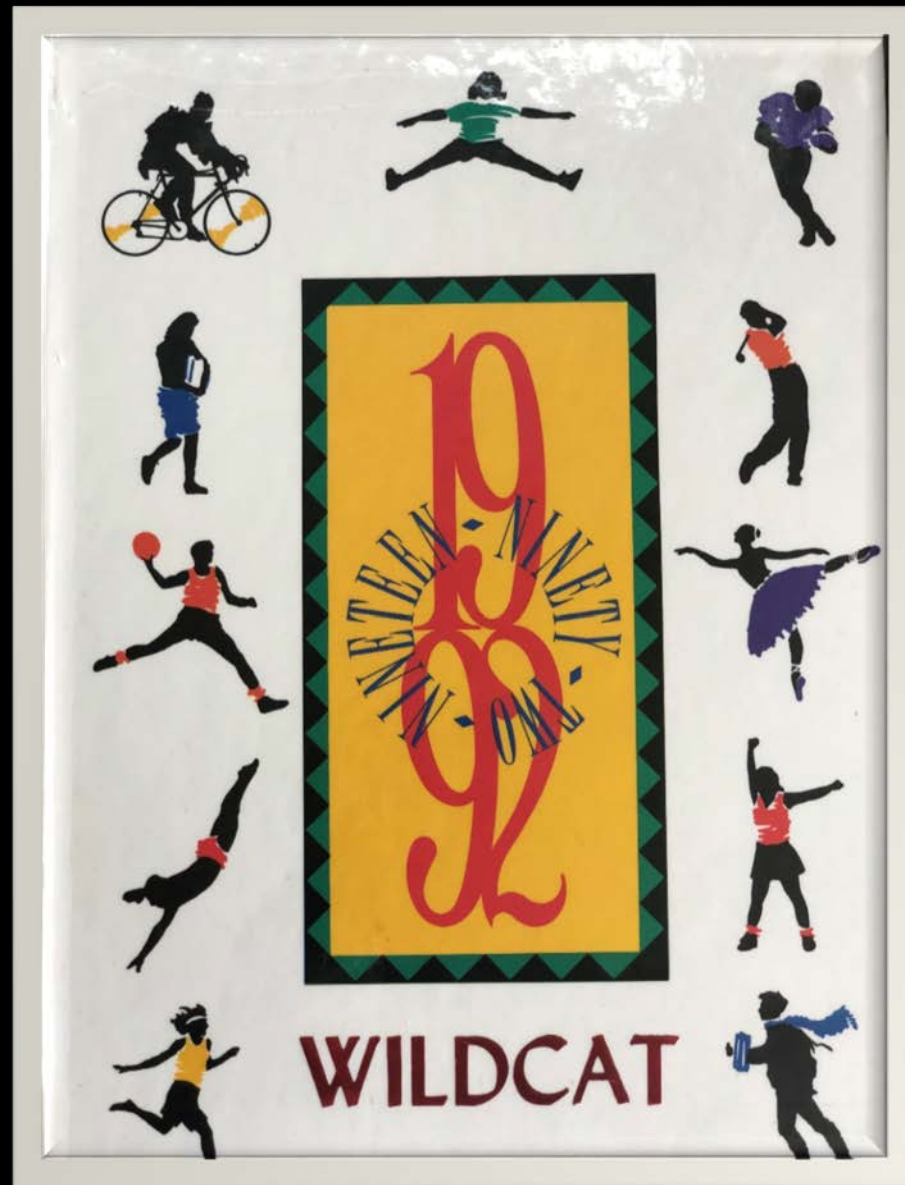

## CSHS PROUD TO BE DRUG FREE

Many things were done this year to help promote a drug free environment this year. Activities included establishing an anti-drug group, being the home of the first anti-drug concert, and designating CSHS a Drug Free/Gun Free school zone.

RAD, Resist Alcohol & Drugs, was introduced this year. Members included students from all grade levels. The sponsor for RAD was Mr. Estrada. Officers were Estrella Diaz-President, Domingo Lumbrenas-Vice President, Onilia Ortiz-Secretary, and Sharon Lozano-Treasurer.

RAD sponsored activities such as the Positive Attitude Contest with the prize of a trip to Fiesta Texas for forty people, introducing the 1 Care Hotline, and sponsoring the Patsy Torres concert.

The National Youth 1 Care Hotline is a 24 hour phone service made available to CSHS students. Everyone was encouraged to call by Ken Harris, a representative from the hotline. Mr. Harris explained that use of the hotline was not directed especially to students with drug problems but to any student with any problem. The service would last until May of 1993.

Patsy Torres and The Full Force Band gave a concert in the gym to promote several drug awareness messages. High school students were dismissed during the last five minutes of third period to attend. After lunch, students from Central and Middle Elementary attended the concert. At the end of the second concert, Mrs. Torres was presented a RAD t-shirt from several members.

Cartizo Springs High School was officially designated as a Drug Free/Gun Free school zone by Ed Hodges, a representative from State Senator Phil Grumm and Ron Ederer, the U.S. Attorney General. Both men attended a ceremony along with student council members, all class officers, and all Rad members in the band hall. A brief welcome was given by Mr. Saldana, then, Mr. Costilla introduced the guests. Onilia Ortiz gave a speech on why it was important to lead drug-free life. Mr. Ederer informed students on statistics of drug relations among teens. Mr. Hodges explained the consequences of what would happen if someone were to violate rules in our new school zone.

The University Interscholastic League program had many participants. They attended practice meets in Laredo, Pleasanton, Del Rio, and at various schools in San Antonio. Students worked very hard to perfect their techniques to secure a trip to regional competition.

This year's district competition was held in Pleasanton. Carrio was very successful placing 3rd as a team and advancing as many as ten individuals toward regional competition. The Calculator Team swept their event taking the Top Team trophy home. In the individual Calculator competition, Sharon Lozano placed 1st, Eddie Perez placed 3rd, and Jerry Lopez placed 4th. Dora Diaz and Estella Diaz placed 4th and 5th respectively in Literary Criticism, but still advanced to regionals. 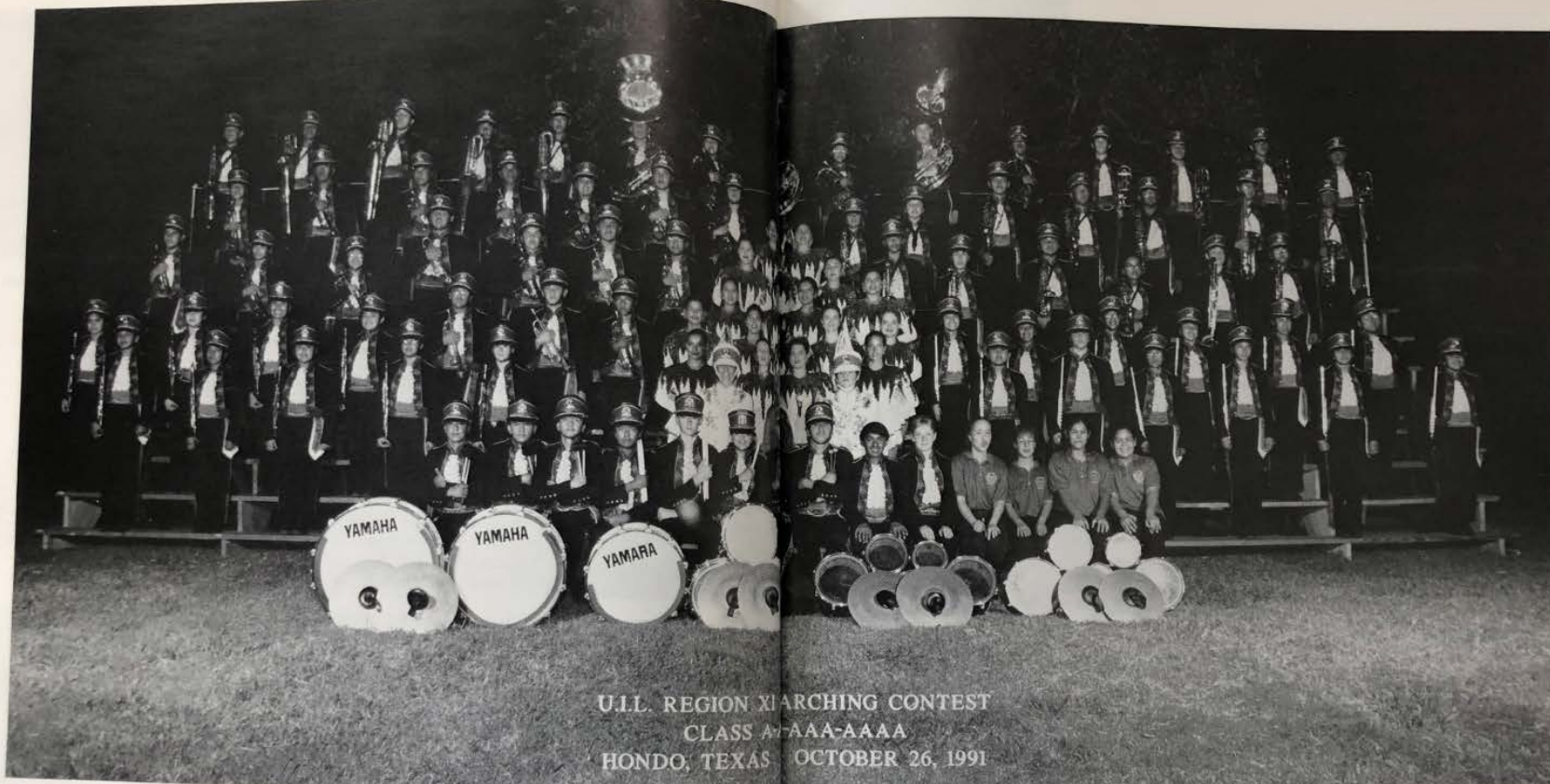

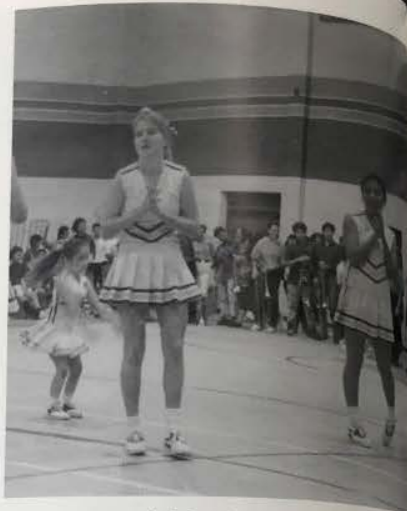

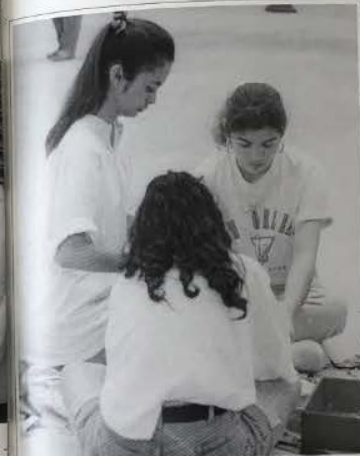

The sophomores also contributed a lot to the life of CSHS. They competed in UIL events and in sports and other extra-curricular activities.



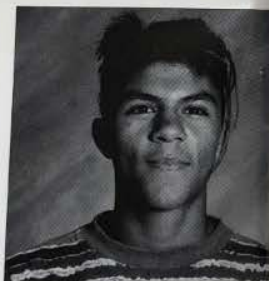

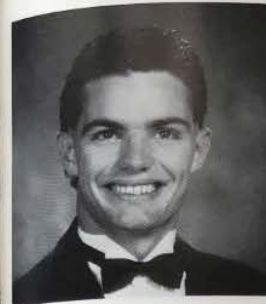

When the song ended, parents, family members and friends came down to the field to congratulate the seniors.

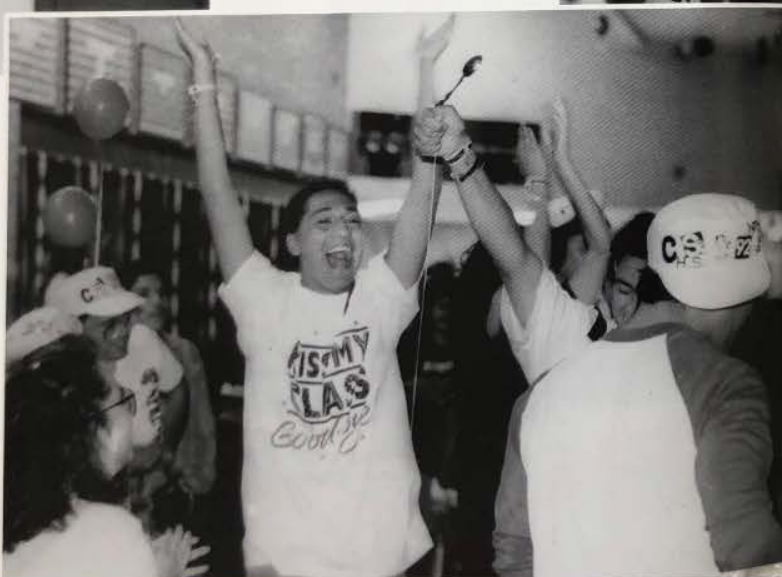
